The Letters of admission of the Goods of the said deceased granted in the month of September 1814 to William Mount Esq: the natural and lawful Brother of the said deceased under the erroneous suggestion that he died Intestate on the renunciation of Christiana Harris wife of Robert Harris the natural and lawful Brother and next of kin of the said deceased having been first revoked and declared null and void by Intestacy Act as by acts of Court appear.

I Elizabeth Marshall widow of the parish of Godalming in the County of Surrey being of sound and disposing mind and memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say first I will that all my just Debts and funeral Charges be paid and discharged by my Executor hereinafter named then I give and bequeath unto my Grandson William Clitty who is now in the United States of America all those my Tenements situated in the Town and parish of Godalming in the County of Surrey one Tenement being now in my own occupation and the other in the occupation of Henry Boxall Blacksmith together with the Garden yard outhouses and premises thereto attached and now in the occupation of myself and the said Henry Boxall to the said William Clitty his heirs and assigns for ever upon condition that the said William Clitty shall pay or cause to be paid unto my Grandson Frederick Clitty the sum of Three hundred pounds and unto my Granddaughter Ann Clitty the sum of Three hundred pounds the above named two sums are to be paid when my Granddaughter Ann Clitty shall have attained the age of Twenty one year also I will that the said William Clitty shall not sell nor dispose of the above named Tenements and premises until my Granddaughter Ann Clitty shall have attained the age of twenty one year then I give and bequeath unto my said Grandson William Clitty the forty three Sterling frames now standing in my stocking masts Shop then I give and bequeath unto my Grandson Frederick Clitty and unto my Granddaughter Ann Clitty the Interest arising from the use of Three hundred pounds now on mortgage on lands and premises belonging to George Mansel of Court in the parish of Frousham in the County of Surrey the said interest to be equally divided between the aforesaid Frederick and Ann Clitty during their natural lives and at their decease the principal to be divided equally between the surviving heirs of each of them I will that my household furniture stock in Trade various Tools and Implements of Trade agreeable to an Inventory now in hand be sold by auction when my aforesaid Granddaughter Ann Clitty shall have attained the age of twenty one year the sums arising from such sale I give and bequeath unto my aforesaid Grandson Frederick Clitty and unto my aforesaid Granddaughter Ann Clitty to be equally divided between them then I give and bequeath unto my aforesaid Granddaughter Ann Clitty Ann Woods my sister and Sarah the wife of Henry Boxall all my Clothes and wearing apparel to be at my decease equally divided between them also I give and bequeath unto Ann Woods my sister the sum of nineteen pounds nineteen shillings and unto Sarah the wife of Henry Boxall the sum of ten pounds then I give and bequeath unto Henry Coston parish Clerk of Godalming my pew situated in the north aisle of Godalming Church upon condition that he permit and allow my Grandson Frederick Clitty and my Granddaughter Ann Clitty to have access to it at all times when they may desire so to do lastly I do make and constitute Mr: William Parson Surgeon of Godalming his heirs and assigns sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament and I do give and allow unto my said Executor his heirs and assigns all necessary charges and expenses which he may incur in the execution of this my last Will and Testament I do also disavow all former Wills and Testaments by me made in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty third day of August in the year of our Lord 1823. Elizabeth Marshall (S) signed sealed published and pronounced by the said Elizabeth Marshall as her last Will and Testament in the presence of us who in her presence and in the presence of each other have hereunto subscribed our names as witnesses. Wm Hull Senr. & Richd Russell & Willm Henry Boston.

Proved at London 13th November 1823 before the Judge by the oath of William
parson the sole Executor to whom admou was granted being first sworn (by Court)

Daniel Thaddeus MacCarthy Esq. Surgeon of His Majesty's Ship *Salmon* being of
sound & legal mind and body and aware of the uncertainty of his life and the
dangers of the sea do make public and declare this my last Will and Testament
freely revoking all former Wills and Testaments by me at any time heretofore made
first I bequeath my soul to God who gave it me and my body to the Earth or sea
as it shall please the almighty disposer of events I give devise and bequeath to
Alexander O'Donnell Esquire of Clover Hill near Skibbereen in the County of Cork and
Kingdom of Ireland and to Philip Harding Esquire of Ffowell near Marazion in
said County all my worldly property Real and personal with my interest in the farm
of Unnemy late Mrs. Mary Wilson as well as all monies whosoever may be now due
to me or to receive I may hereafter become entitled to have their heirs Executors
and assigns and to the survivor of them their heirs Executors and assigns in Trust
to and for the following intents uses and purposes hereinafter mentioned and declared
in Writings by deed of conveyance made to me by Mary Wilson Widow and bearing date
the 5th day of May 1818 Eighteen I am now seized of the farm of Unnemy aforesaid now
yielding yearly the profit rent of about ninety pounds a year payable half yearly
for and during the natural life of the aforesaid Mary Wilson and Writings I have
conveyed or assigned over to Timothy Jordan of Marazion farmer by deed of conveyance
made to him the said Timothy Jordan in the City of Cork on April 1819 notarial
Instrument of Henry MacNamara and Daniel MacNamara are the subscribing witnesses
one half moiety or equal share of the profits of said farm of Unnemy and Writings
I am now indebted in a Bond to Mrs. Judith Daly Widow now living at Clover Hill
aforesaid for one hundred pounds I give with the lawful interest thereon and further
indebted to the aforesaid Timothy Jordan in a Bond for one hundred and fifty three
pounds I give or thereabouts My Will is that all my personal Effects save and excepting
such as are hereinafter bequeathed be disposed of and sold either by public auction
or private sale as my Executors shall deem most expedient and the monies arising
from the sale or disposal thereof be disposed of in the payment of any debts whosoever
may be due of me in Cork and they shall be to any great amount and in the discharge of
my funeral expences whosoever I think may not exceed ten pounds the residue if any left to be
appropriated to the liquidation of my Bond debt to Mrs. Judith Daly My Will also is that
the profits of the aforesaid farm be half yearly paid to Mrs. Judith Daly until my Bond
to her with all the interest be completely discharged after which the profit shall be
paid as soon as received to Mr. Timothy Jordan until my Bond to him with the interest
thereon be fully discharged and satisfied I also bequeath as a collateral security to Mrs.
Daly my deed of assurance on the life of Mrs. Mary Wilson for one hundred pounds
British which I give and bequeath after Mrs. Daly's Bond be discharged to Mr. Timothy
Jordan for the same purpose and when the said Bond is discharged I bequeath to my dear and
legally valued Brother Charles to be disposed of by him as he thinks fit for his own use
and I also bequeath to my Brother after the payment of my two Bond debts as
aforesaid one half share or moiety of my part of the profit rent of Mrs. Wilson's
farm of Unnemy during Mrs. Wilson's life to be paid him half yearly as the said
becomes due with full and perfect right and liberty should any moiety remain due
and unpaid twenty one days after the said sale becomes due to enter upon and distain the
premises and any distress or distresses as there be found to take away unpaid
and dispose of according to Law the remaining share or moiety of the profits of said
farm I give and bequeath for one year as a mark of my affectionate regard and
esteem to my very dear Cousin Ellen Jane of Killymore, Relict of James Jane and as
a compensation to her Sister my very good friend Martin Lander for any loss he
may have sustained thro' my means during my apprenticeship and for not remaining with
him during the entire of the term My Will is that afterwards my share so bequeathed
