

In the Name of God Amen I Elizabeth Marshall widow of the parish of Godalming in the county of Surrey being of sound and disposing mind and memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say first I will that all my just debts and funeral charges be paid and discharged by my executor hereinafter named

item I give and bequeath unto my grandson William Chitty who is now in the United States of America all those my tenements situated in the town and parish of Godalming in the county of Surrey and tenement being now in my own occupation and the store in the occupation of Henry Boxall blacksmith together with the Garden yard workshop and premises thereto attached and now in the occupation of myself and the said Henry Boxall to the said William Chitty his heirs and assigns forever upon condition that the said William Chitty shall pay or cause to be paid unto my grandson Cedric Chitty the sum of three hundred pounds and unto my granddaughter Ann Chitty the sum of three hundred pounds the above named two sons are to be paid when my granddaughter Ann Chitty shall have attained the age of twenty one years also I will that the said William Chitty shall not sell nor dispose of the above named tenements and premises until my granddaughter Ann Chitty shall have attained the age of twenty one years

item I give and bequeath unto my said grandson William Chitty the forty three Stocking frames now standing in my stocking makers shop

item I give and bequeath unto my grandson Cedric Chitty and unto my granddaughter Ann Chitty the interest arising from the use of three hundred and sixty pounds now on mortgage on --- and --- belonging to George Marchant of Churt in the parish of Horsham in the county of Surrey the said interest to be equally divided between the aforesaid Cedric and Ann Chitty during their natural lives and at their decease the principal to be divided equally between the surviving heirs of each of them

item I will that my household furniture stock in trade various goods and implements of trade agreeable to an inventory now in hand be sold by auction when my aforesaid granddaughter Ann Chitty shall have attained the age of twenty one years the sums arising from the such sale I give and bequeath unto my aforesaid grandson Cedric Chitty and unto my aforesaid granddaughter Ann Chitty to be equally divided between them

item I give and bequeath to my aforesaid granddaughter Ann Chitty Ann Woods my sister and Sarah the wife of Henry Boxall all my clothes and wearing apparel to be at my decease equally divided between them

also I give and bequeath unto Ann Woods my sister the sum of nineteen pounds nineteen shillings and unto Sarah wife of Henry Boxall the sum of ten pounds

item I give and bequeath unto Henry Coston parish clerk of Godalming my pew situated in the north aisle of Godalming church upon condition that he permit and allow my grandson Cedric Chitty and my granddaughter Ann Chitty to have access to it at all times when they may desire so to do

lastly I do make and constitute Mr William Parson surgeon of Godalming his heirs and assigns sole executor of this my last Will and Testament and I do give and allow unto my said executor his heirs and assigns all necessary charges and expenses which he may incur in the execution of this my last Will and Testament

I also disavow and renege all former Wills and Testaments by me made --- --- whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty third day of August in the year of our Lord 1823
