

This is the Last Will and Testament of me Lucy Alexander late of Brighton and Hove in the County of Sussex but now of Edenbridge in the County of Kent Spinster I give and bequeath all my personal estate goods chattels and effects whatsoever and wheresoever and of what nature or kindsoever unto my brother Thomas Alexander of Edenbridge aforesaid timber merchant and my brother in law Thomas Smith of Saint --- Gray in the said county of Kent surgeon their executors administrators and assigns upon trust to collect convert and get in the same and in the first place to pay my just debts and funeral and testamentary expenses and the charges of proving this my Will and subject thereto upon trust to pay or retain unto the said Thomas Alexander the sum of eight hundred pounds sterling as soon as conveniently may be after my decease and also to pay unto my Sister Ann Alexander the sum of one hundred and twenty pounds sterling as soon as conveniently may be after my decease and upon trust in the next place to pay the interest dividends and annual product of the residue of my said estate until my Sister Ann Alexander during her natural life for her separate use free from the debts or control of her present or any future husband and so that her receipts alone shall be sufficient discharges for the same and from and immediately after her decease upon trust to pay the several legacies following (that is to say)

To my Sister Caroline the Wife of the said Thomas Smith the sum of eight hundred pounds sterling to and for her own separate use and benefit free from the debts control or engagements of her present or any future husband and so that her receipt shall be a sufficient discharge for the same

To my nephews and nieces Alexander Marshall Murray Marshall Sarah Marshall Emily Marshall Frederick Marshall and Henry Marshall children of George and Sarah Marshall of Godalming in the county of Surrey the sum of nineteen pounds nineteen shillings each And to my Sister Sarah Marshall the sum of one hundred pounds sterling to and for her own separate use and benefit free from the debts control or engagements of her present or any future husband and so that her receipt alone shall be a sufficient discharge for the same and

I direct that the trustees and trustee for the time being of this my Will shall stand possessed of and interested in the sum of eight hundred pounds sterling upon trust to pay or permit and suffer my Sister Mary the wife of Robert Saxby of Brighton and Hove aforesaid wine merchant to receive the income thereof for her life and for her own separate use and benefit and free from the debts control or engagements of her present or any future husband and so that her separate receipt alone shall be a sufficient discharge for the same but so that she shall have no power to anticipate sell or charge the same income or any part thereof and from and after her decease upon trust to pay or permit and suffer the said Robert Saxby and his assigns to receive the income thereof for and during his natural life and from and after the decease of the survivor of them the said Mary Saxby and Robert Saxby upon trust to pay and divide the principal unto and among such one or more of the children of the said Mary Saxby as being a son or sons shall attain the age of twenty one years or being a daughter or daughters shall attain that age or marry which shall first happen to be equally divided between them if more than one share and share alike as tenants in common

And I authorise and empower the trustess or trustee for the time being of this my Will after the decease of the survivor of them the said Robert Saxby and Mary his wife to apply the whole or any part of the annual income of the contingent share of each child during his or her minority towards his or her maintenance and education and I direct the unapplied income (if any) to be accumulated and added to the principal of the same

share but nevertheless with power to apply the whole of such accumulations towards the future maintenance or education of such child from whose share such accumulations shall have arisen and as to all the residue of said personal Estate I direct the trustees or trustee for the time being of this my Will to stand possessed of the same upon trust for such person or persons and in such manner in all respects as my said Sister Ann Alexander whether covert or sole shall by deed executed in the presence of and attested by one or more witness or witnesses or by her last Will executed and attested according to the statute for the amendment of the law with respect to Wills appoint and in default of appointment To the use of my nephew Thomas Alexander son of the aforesaid Thomas Alexander absolutely And I authorise and empower the said trustees or trustees for the time being to lay out and invest all and singular the said trust monies until the same shall respectively become payable under the respective trusts aforesaid in their or his names or name in the parliamentary stocks or public funds of Great Britain or at interest --- on government or real securities in England and Wales (but not in Ireland) and from time to time to alter vary and transfer from the same trust monies so to be laid out and invested as aforesaid upon or into any any other stocks funds or securities of the like nature when and as often as they or he shall think fit and I declare that the receipts of the said trustees and trustee for the time being shall be sufficient discharge to all and every person and persons paying or transferring to them any monies stocks funds and securities by virtue of this my Will and shall --- discharge such person or persons from liability to see to the application thereof And I hereby declare that if my said trustees or either of them or any person or persons to be appointed under this clause shall die or be unwilling or incompetent to execute the trusts of this my Will it shall be lawful for the competent trustees or trustee for the time being (if any) whether retiring from the office of trustee or not or (if none) for the executors or administrators of the last surviving trustee to substitute by any writing under their or his hands or hand any fit person or persons in whom alone or (as the case may be) jointly with the surviving or continuing trustees or trustee my trust estate shall be vested and I exempt every trustee of my Will from any liability for losses occurring without his own willful default and authorise him to retain and allow to his Cotrustee or Cotrustees all expenses incidental to the Trusteeship

Lastly I appoint the said Thomas Alexander and Thomas Smith Executors of this my Will hereby revoking all former wills and codicils by me at any time heretofore made in Witness whereof I the said Lucy Alexander the testatrix have to this my last Will and Testament contained in three sheets of paper set my hand to each sheet thereof this twenty eighth day of June one thousand eight hundred and forty nine

signed by the said testatrix as her last Will and Testament in the presence of us present at the same time who at her request in her presence and in the presence of each other have subscribed our names as Witnesses / the words "and also to pay unto my Sister Ann Alexander the sum of one hundred and twenty pounds sterling as soon as conveniently may be after my decease" having been first interlined between the ninth and tenth lines of the first page
